Subject: Invitation to the SHSE Evaluation and Implementation Committee in University Teaching

Because the social sciences and humanities (SSH) also present themselves as a source of political dynamics, it can be admitted that the state of modern societies, or even of the contemporary world, is primarily a reflection of their quality.

In the event of an impasse which the planet is currently facing (climate change, loss of bearings, questioning of the formal and informal standards structuring the world, continuous increase of structural inequalities and its consequences, identity withdrawal, structural resurgence of various forms of violence, etc.), can we deduce a failure of the social sciences & humanities? If so, what are the causes?

Addressing this issue means questioning the knowledge paradigm governing the SSH since at least the 18th century, that is, understanding the coherent supports and principles prescribing a direction to the construction of knowledge. This questioning should open up a perspective of structural reforms of the SSH, that is to say, propose an alternative to the paradigm of knowledge that has dominated university teaching since the 18th century. Fundamentally, these reforms should, initially, highlight another (a new) understanding of the human being. Thus, understanding human societies differently, understanding the current impasse and reversing the current trend would require a new understanding of the human being. This fundamentally iconoclastic project should open new tracts for knowledge construction in all disciplines of the social sciences and humanities (Economics, Law, Sociology, Philosophy of Cognitive Science, Anthropology, Political Science, General Philosophy, Theology, etc.). At the end of this project, we should expect the SSH to offer new arguments to Politicians, fundamentally scientific arguments that would motivate (or push) them to change the current trend for humanity, for Life, for our societies and for the planet.

To do this, Professor XXX, I am pleased to invite you to the Evaluation and Implementation Committee for Social and Human Sciences Engineering (SHSE) in university teaching. It's a committee made up of various international experts from different fields and branches of the

SSH. Given the nature of your various known commitments, I believe you could play a significant role in the success of this project.

The SHSE is the result of more than 14 years of research based on the identity and dynamics of biological determinism. This research establishes biology as the foundation for knowledge construction in the humanities and social sciences. This research lays the foundations for making social sciences a pure science, like Physics, Chemistry, etc. For a more detailed overview, I invite you to consult the related documents attached to the email I will send you.

In addition to being cited among the pioneers of the emergence of SHSE, immersion in this project will enrich your thinking and expand your knowledge base, enabling you to write original scientific articles or books based on biology. Similarly, this immersion will provide you with additional technical arguments to support your various activist positions. In particular, for example, these arguments will contribute to strengthening the technical credibility of your legitimate alarm about the need for a change of course (Book Title, Publisher, 2023); Specifically, from biological determinism, we can theoretically demonstrate how perpetual growth, under the aegis of the economic society model driven by the neoliberal paradigm, mechanically destroys psychic, social, societal (including economic and increased poverty on a human scale in the world) and natural environment balances.
